CLASSICAL PERFORMANCE (STRINGS), MM

The CCPA Master of Music performance program prepares students for careers as solo, chamber music, and large ensemble performers, while instilling habits consistent with success in the professional environment.

The program's objectives are to:

- Refine technical and musical skills with study and performance of challenging and advanced repertory;
- Provide ongoing ensemble performing experiences, with higher expectations for leadership in collaborative musical situations;
- Prepare students for the rigorous demands of the music profession by teaching the discipline and self-motivation necessary to achieve excellence;
- Introduce students to the traditions, operations, practices, and opportunities of the professional symphony orchestra;
- Provide opportunities to investigate topics and repertories in advanced coursework.

- At one jury a movement from a concerto (including cadenza), preferably with piano accompaniment, will be presented.
- At one jury a sonata or short piece displaying a range of technical/ musical style, preferably with piano accompaniment, will be presented.

Students will perform a movement from an unaccompanied work (e.g. Bach, Ysaye, Kodaly, étude) at each jury.

One of the above works must be memorized. No repetition of repertoire from previous juries is allowed.

All violinists are required to perform a movement from a Mozart Concerto in at least one jury during their degree study.

Individual faculty members are encouraged to implement additional requirements for students in their studios. Their students are bound by these requirements.
