

ORCHESTRAL STUDIES (BRASS, PERCUSSION, AND WINDS), PROFESSIONAL DIPLOMA (PD)

The highly selective two-year post-baccalaureate Orchestral Studies diploma is open to students majoring in violin, viola, violoncello, double bass, harp, flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, horn, trumpet, trombone, tuba, or percussion, who are preparing for careers as orchestral musicians. The program possesses the distinctive feature of intensive focus on preparing orchestral repertoire and excerpts through an additional half-hour private lesson component and weekly classes devoted specifically to audition preparation.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for acceptance to the diploma, students must demonstrate significant familiarity with, and accomplishment in, orchestral excerpts and repertoire, in addition to presenting the solo audition requirements for their instrument as published on the CCPA Admission and Audition (<https://www.roosevelt.edu/academics/programs/masters-in-orchestral-studies-mm/#pnlAdmissionSection>) Information web page.

Grade Requirements

- **Applied Lessons:** B- is the minimum passing grade for applied study (FRHN 461 FRENCH HORN (APPLIED PD OS), TRPT 461 TRUMPET (APPLIED PD OS), TRBN 461 TROMBONE (APPLIED PD OS), or TUBA 461 TUBA (APPLIED PD OS)).
- **Recitals:** B- is the minimum passing grade for PERF 418 SOLO PERFORMANCE.

RECITAL REPERTOIRE

PERF 418 SOLO PERFORMANCE

Brass: 60 minutes of music is required. Chamber music may be included with the permission of the applied teacher. The recital will be graded by the applied instructor and at least one other faculty member.

JURY REPERTOIRE

Brass: Brass majors present solo juries that consist of ten minutes of music. The repertoire should consist of a major work for the instrument, or an alternate piece presented with the permission of the applied professor. No repetition of repertoire from previous juries is allowed. Individual faculty members are encouraged to implement additional requirements for students in their studios, to which their students are bound.

- **Recitals:** B- is the minimum passing grade for PERF 418 SOLO PERFORMANCE.

RECITAL REPERTOIRE

PERF 418 SOLO PERFORMANCE

Percussion: 60 minutes of music, to be divided among marimba/vibraphone/xylophone, timpani and multi percussion/advanced snare drum solo suite. All recital repertory requirements are at the discretion of the applied instructor. Recitals are graded by the Program Director and one other faculty member.

N.B. Students may substitute a formal orchestral audition to be performed for a faculty panel composed of a minimum of two performance faculty members. The audition will consist of a full professional-level excerpt list on both timpani and percussion. The entire list will be performed for the panel and include 60 minutes of music. Students who wish for their final performance project to be satisfied by this formal orchestral audition must complete a Recital Exception Petition.

JURY REPERTOIRE

Percussion: Students must present eight excerpts for the PERF 411 jury, only two of which may be repeated from any previous semester.

Grade Requirements

JURY REPERTOIRE

Woodwinds: Fifteen minutes of music. Students are strongly encouraged (and some may be required by their applied professors) to perform solo literature from memory. All repertoire must be approved by the applied professor. No repetition of repertoire from previous juries is allowed. Individual faculty members are encouraged to implement additional requirements for students in their studios, to which their students are bound.
